Victorian Heritage Register - known as 1 Gleadell St in Clause 43

## Physical Description 1

The former Gas Inspector's residence at 1 Gleadell Street, Richmond, is a single-storey detached building, constructed of polychromatic brick on a bluestone base. It has a transverse gabled roof which is clad in slate and penetrated by a pair of capped chimneys. The building is constructed on the property boundary to Gleadell Street, although the front door is set back within a narrow semi-circular arched porch. The entrance is flanked by semi-circular arched double-hung sash windows which are recessed within larger semi-circular arches with moulded brick archivolt. There is a row of brick brackets along the eaves line. The two parapeted gable ends on the north and south elevations each have an oculus vent near the apex.
