Interpretation of Site	Site represents sawmilling and domestic activities in the area. The site has long been abandoned and no other activity appears to have taken place. The site does seem to be maintained with cut grass and neat tracks.
Archaeological Significance	The site appears to present a relatively rare example of a small sawmillijng site combined with remnants of a small community it supported. The abandonment of the land suggests that any archaeological deposits would be intact.
Historical Significance	Historically significant on a regional level as part of the sawmilling industry that supported the development of nearby towns.

Heritage Inventory History of Site: The Cambarville Sawmilling Company operated this mill between about 1939 and 1970 and at times supported a community of up to 60 people.
