Interpretation of Site	Briefly used for sawmilling in the early 20th C, the abandoned and regenerated as bushland. Appears that area is used as a source of water for the CFA. The original site card suggested picnic activities but this function not observed at the site in 2009.
Archaeological Significance	No apparent archaeological features but vegetation very overgrown which may obscure features. Low significance.

Heritage Inventory History of Site: Hogan and Kirkpatrick established this small mill circa 1927. It was powered by a 14 hp steam engine. After operating at this site for 7 years, Hogan and Kirkpatrick moved to the Cockatoo area

and later (1940s) back in the vicinity of Tomahawk Gap.
