22/08/1865: three compartment shaft, 8 ft 6 inches by 3 ft 6 inches clear, down 130ft; using a 12 inch by 30 inch horizontal high pressure steam engine, a Cornish flue boiler: 17 ft by 5ft with an exhaust steam feedwater heater, 10 inch draw lift with 6 foot stroke, so worked as to give the envine drivers a rest on Sundays, two 16 ft diameter puddlings machines belt

07/1865-08/1865: recorded production of 43ozs 7dwt 23gr (or 1.350kg) (Reference: GEDIS, Ballarat Mine Data, October 1993).

09/1865: have been getting paying wash-dirst for several weeks and the claim looks promising (Reference: Mining Surveyors and Registrars Reports, Smythesdale Division, in P.Milner, TR 86/4,p743).

03/1866: ground abandoned; to be taken up again with machinery already on it (Reference: Mining Surveyors and Registrars Reports, Smythesdale Division, in P.Milner, TR 86/4,p747).
