Archaeological Significance	No evidence for significant later disturbance. There is currently an open asphalt carpark at the location of this site. It is therefore highly likely that structural remains and occupation deposits might be preserved here.
Historical Significance	19th Century residence within an industrial and residential precinct in Footscray. May have housed workers from the tannery.

History

Joseph's road precinct defined by the railway line and bridge built in the 1850's - Nth Boundry. Footscray township (surveyed in 1849) to the suth. Between 1840s and 1860s rural land use and a sugarbeet distillery. 1860s -1879 Urban developement and the tanneries. 1880s -1915 residential and urban growth. 1910 -1952 expansion of tanneries.
