### **Physical Description 1**

This building is a pleasing single storey composition in the form of a triple arcade on masonry piers with drafted margins .and matching voussoirs rising to keystone scrolls. Within the arcade a second order is visible surrounding the central door and the flanking windows.

Above a simple dentillated cornice is a plain pediment over a surprisingly plain parapet which may have been stripped. The circular transom light and the details of the voussoirs and dressings are very similar to the former Gas Company Office (corner Grenville and Lewis Street). It is quite possible that Architects Caselli & Figgis were also responsible for the design of this building. This building is an important streetscape element to the Lydiard Street precinct. The facade is substantially intact, if somewhat heavily detailed, and the building appears to be in good condition.
