Site of the first gold discovery in the Shire and from 1861-71 source of most of the winnable gold in the Shire. Site also of the Darley quarry from 1858, whose freestone was considered for use in Parliament House and the Treasury in Melbourne.

The site has scientific significance for its archaeological research potential.
