Veterans Description for Public

The Tylden War Memorial is situated at the intersection of the three main roads that form the heart of Tylden, at the end of the Woodend and Trentham roads. The memorial comprises of a Harcourt granite obelisk surrounded by an iron chain and granite post fence. It was unveiled in December 1921 to commemorate the loss of six Tylden servicemen in the First World War. Originally it stood some thirty metres away but was moved to its present location due to road re-alignment.
