The Albert Park Infantry Drill Hall, on Albert Road Drive, is a timber hall from the late Colonial period. From the period 1884-1901 militia orderly rooms were built by the Victorian Public Works Department and were universally of timber and of similar design. The seminal examples of this era are Ballarat, Bendigo, Castlemaine, Portland and St Kilda which are all to the design of the PWD architect Samuel Bindley. Of the twenty-eight examples of this type built, only eight remain.
