## History

J.D. Burnie bought allotment 26 in 1878 and built this house sometime after that. Historical evidence (spreadbourough & Anderson, 1983) also show 'Murray' settlement in this area during the 1850's. The house was dismantled in 1950 by Ormond Howe and materials re-used to construct adjacent shearing shed.
