Interpretation of Site The tramway bridge at Lake Bunga is the only significant surviving relic of the outlet tramway between the mill site at Burnt Bridge Road and Lakes Entrance.

History

ALEXANDER MURRAY, IN ASSOCIATION WITH FRANK STUART, ESTABLISHED A SAWMILL IN 1891 ON THE TOORLOO ARM OF LAKE TYERS. THEIR TIMBER TRAMLIN EXTENDED SOUTH-WEST TO LAKES ENTRANCE, CROSSING LAKE BUNGA EN ROUTE ON A TIMBER BRIDGE. THE OPERATION CLOSED IN 1893.
