MOST HISTORY CENTRES ON BRISTOL HILL ITSELF WHICH WAS MINED FROM MID 1850S. FRANCIS LAIDMAN FOUND GOLD THERE IN 1854. EARLY ON, THE DIGGINGS WERE SHALLOW AND THEY CALLED THE AREA POOR MAN'S DIGGINGS. ELLERY AND PASSMORE HAD A RICH CLAIM THERE IN 1868 AND THEN OTHER COMPANIES BECAME INTERESTED.
