The property is considered to be local historical significance due to its association with the Coowerp homestead. The homestead itself is of historical significance to the local community as well as the Yarra Valley region. The significance is the subject of a concurrent study. [See site card.]

Interpretation of Site	Originally used for pastoral purposes, now site has been redeveloped as a golf course, with the homestead still standing
Historical Significance	Historically significant to the region. One of the first homesteads built, and until recent redevelopment was used consistently for pastoral purposes.
Archaeological Significance	Potential for archaeological deposits to exist around homestead. Text from 1922 auction notice (in original site card) provides good detail as to what could possibly exist.

Thomas MacIntyre settled in Yering in 1852 and the Coowerp Homestead was built by his son Gilbert in 1880. Homestead was put up for auction in 1922.
