The dump is significant as representative of domestic and rural artefacts used during the early occupation of the property.

Interpretation of Site	Used as pastoral land in early 20th century until purchase by Boral Quarries. Now reserve "buffer" land at Boral's Montrose Quarry.
Archaeological Significance	As the site is to be left reserved as buffer land for the quarry, and no occupation has taken place since Boral's ownership, it is likely the integrity of any archaeological deposits are intact. The site is not a rare site type within the state.
Historical Significance	Local historical significance as the site relates to early domestic occupation in the region.

History

THE LOT WAS ORIGINALLY SOLD AS A SUB-DIVISION OF THE CROWN ALLOTMENT 38 IN 1942 TO MR NICHOLLS AND MR JACKSON. THE LOT CHANGED HANDS THREE MORE TIMES UNTIL MR C CALLAM SOLD THE PROPERTY TO ALBION REID PTY TLD IN 1968. THE ARTEFACTS WITHIN IN THE DUMP INDICATE THAT THE DUMP IS LIKELY TO BE ASSOCIATED WITH THE EARLIEST OCCUPATION OF THE PROPERTY FROM THE EARLY 1940S TO THE EARLY 1950S. THE AUSTRALIAN GLASS MANUFACTURERS (AGM) MARK ON SEVERAL OF THE DOMESTIC BOTTLES DATE FROM 1934 TO 1948. (ARNOLD 2002:4)
