The site is a farm and house site that may be useful in interpreting rural life in Epping in the past. The site has local significance and considerable research potential.

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| Interpretation of Site | The ruins are likely to be a homestead or site of a farm. The paved areas, cement platform and drain may be remnants of a dairy, piggery or early stable. The dairy industry was prevalent in the Epping area in the historical period. |

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History

The grantee of the land was M Skehan in 1853 for a total of 158 acres. The land was quickly sold to W Jarrett

(1853) before passing to the Butler family who held the title from 1861-1896. Subsequent owners - E McLaughlin purchased 1896, MS Mack (nee Houston) 1913; HJ Hehr purchased 1942 then SM & CR Brykman purchased land in 1978. The age of the farm house unknown. Further research is required.
