The hut is of local cultural significance and moderate scientific significance. The hut is an example of property management on large stations in the region.

History

The property was originally part of the 'Harton Hills' squatting run, taken up in the 1840s and subdivided in the 1860s. the hut was used by shepherds/boundary riders as it was the midway point of 'Moyne Falls'. After soldier settlement the hut was no longer used as the roads improved and travel was easier to manage (Tom Robertson pers.comm).
