Statement of Significance

Last updated on - May 8, 2006

Newmann's farm house, outbuildings, former slab hut site and stone well, all date from the early period of European settlement in this area. The farm house and outbuildings show the changing functions of rural life, as needs arose, through to the 1950s. This is part of the unrecorded history of this area, has great potential for sub-surface deposits, and has been given a significance rating of high at the local level.

History

Carl Newmann purchased 80 acres east of Bassetts Road prior to 1870. He is attributed with building Newmanns farm house and possibly some of the outbuildings (Gould 1991). However the Bassetts were probably responsible for the dairy during the c1930s. Other features on property such as slab hut site and the stone 'well' are possibly attributed Newmanns period of ownership. The dairy has seen improvements and extensions, particularly in the 1950s during the changeover from Bassetts to Rodgers ownership.
