

# **Physical Description 1**

No information regarding this building has been ascertained. The strap work chimneys and ground floor window details would appear to derive from the periods between 1890 and 1905.

This building in unusual for the sue of various elements that derive from different periods and styles. Essentially it is a simple two storied brick house with a slate hipped roof, with a side wing providing enclosure for the entry which has a frieze and pier of distinctive Ballarat style cast iron.

The front windows are notable - the upper two have semi-circular heads with wide rendered mouldings edged with , terminating at impost level. The arch is filled with delicate fretwork timber blind hoods.. The two storeys are separated by a wide rendered panel with moulded cornices and brackets. The ground floor windows are of an unusual eclectic design. A pair of window beneath a recessed elliptical arch with plaster decoration are separated by a pier with a Corinthian colonette.

The building is externally intact and the massing and detailing wake this a unique building on a state wide basis.
