## **Veterans Description for Public**

The Malvern Town Hall War Memorial, located in the foyer of the Hall on Glenferrie Road, was erected on 23rd August 1931. Carved by Paul Montford, the memorial comprises of three marble relief statues; a mother cradling a child and a soldier. The figures stand, with heads cast down, on either side of a tablet adorned with a wreath

and the Rising Sun emblem. Resting between them is an honour roll book encased in glass, which records in illuminated script the names of those Malvern and Prahan servicemen who died in the First World War. The tablet is inscribed with the dates of the First World War, Second World War, Malaya, Korea, Borneo and Vietnam.
