## **Memorial Window Description & History**

On behalf of the Pakington Street Methodist Church, Mr. Thewlis ordered two windows from Brooks, Robinson & Co. in January 1946. The windows each measured approximately 102 x 24 inches and the chosen subjects were *St. Michael* and *The Crown of Life* in commemoration of men from the congregation who had fought in World War I and World War II. The cartoon of *St. Michael* was previously used for a soldier's memorial at Holy Trinity Anglican Church, Oakleigh, but *The Crown of Life* was a new version of the subject.
