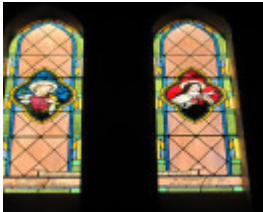

Memorial Window Description & History

The foundation stone for St. Francis Xavier Church was laid by the Archbishop of Melbourne, the Most Reverend Daniel Mannix, DD, on 19 December 1937. The two-light windows throughout the church were diamond quarry leadlights with busts of saints inserted into the upper central portion of each light. Representations of *St. Joseph* and *St. Teresa* were inserted into this two-light, with the right-hand *St. Teresa*, designated to the memory of the AIF men. It is likely that the memorial two-light window installed when the church opened in 1938 and only a year or later the wording of the inscription was to include servicemen of the Second World War.
