Memorial Window Description & History

The Melbourne daily *Argus* reported the intention of Wesley Church to install a four-light stained glass window, based on the *Martyrdom of St. Stephen*, in memory of the 1,500 Australian Methodist soldiers who died on active service. It was hoped that the window would be unveiled early in 1921.

The window was designed and made by Brooks, Robinson & Co.
