Interpretation of Site	Remains of a small weatherboard house constructed prior to 1876 within the township of Fyansford. A number of outbuildings and sheds were later built. The house was still standing c.1940s-1950s, however the land was subsequently acquired by Australian Portland Cement. At this stage, it is not known when the house was demolished or when occupation of the building ceased.
Archaeological Significance	The archaeological significance of the site is currently unknown but the place has been identified as having high archaeological sensitivity (Hewitt et.al 2014: 189). It is highly likely additional subsurface deposits and features will be present across the site however without further archaeological investigation the integrity, and nature cannot be determined. Therefore the archaeological significance of the place is yet to be established.
Historical Significance	The site is historically significant as a former house associated with the early development of the township of Fyansford.
