What is significant?

Single Algerian Oak located within vacant block at 9 Main Street, Pakenham.

How is it significant?

The tree is of regional significance to Cardinia Shire.

Why is it significant?

The Algerian Oak is of significance as a commemorative planting to mark the Federation of Australia in 1901, and the activities undertaken by the local community to mark that important event. The tree is of considerable amenity value, with a fine, wide spreading form.
