Potenital fo post-contact archaeological deposits exists within the site. early use of the site for campsites (i.e. Canvas Town) is likely to have left minimal archaeological signature, however, where apparent they are likely to materialise as post holes or refuse deposits of an ephemeral nature.

Archaeological Significance

Potential for archaeological deposits relating to nineteenth century structures in many contexts (i.e. industrial phase dating through the mid to late nineteenth century). Posible archaeological remains could include structural foundations, artefactural material (i.e. refuse deposts) relating to occupation and industrial use of the site and yard surfaces. Re-use of nineteenth century structures for West's Theatre.

Historical Significance

The site has the ability to inform on the early development of South Melbourne, including early evidence of the the Canvas Town. The sitehas strongpotential for late nineteenth century industrial sites and the establishment of Melbourne's first purpose built picture theatre -with acontinued themeas a recreational areathroughout the twenty-first century.
