This place is included on the Victorian Heritage Inventory, for its potential to contain historical archaeological remains associated with the settlement and growth of early Melbourne. Under the terms of the Heritage Act 2017 there is protection for all historical archaeological sites and objects in the state.

Archaeological Significance	<p>Potential for archaeological deposits relating to nineteenth century structures in many contexts (i.e. industrial phase dating through the mid to late nineteenth century). Possible archaeological remains could include structural foundations, artefactual material (i.e. refuse deposits) relating to occupation and industrial use of the site and yard surfaces. Re-use of nineteenth century structures for West's Theatre.</p>
Historical Significance	<p>The site has the ability to inform on the early development of South Melbourne, including early evidence of the Canvas Town. The site has strong potential for late nineteenth century industrial sites and the establishment of Melbourne's first purpose built picture theatre - with a continued theme as a recreational area throughout the twenty-first century.</p>

## History

### Summary Timeline

Pre-1835: Swamp and wetland

Early Post-Contact: Swamp land and paddocks; broader area partially occupied by 'Canvas Town'.

1880: Subdivision of study area, possible period of industrial construction.

1909 - 1918: West's Theatre

1918 - 1923: Hoyt's Lyceum

1923: Demolition of Hoyt's Lyceum and construction of the YMCA Hall.

1982-3: Demolition of YMCA Hall.

2013 - Present: The land has been levelled, and the study area is now occupied by the Testing Grounds
