The former residence has a low-moderate archaeological potential for early 20th century deposits associated with domestic life and the broader market garden economy in Heatherton. The site is therefore assessed to be of low-moderate archaeological significance.

Interpretation of Site
Kingston Linear Walk Reserve is the site of a former residence, the building was constructed by 1931 and demolished some time between 1975 and 1984. It functioned as a domestic space, in a growing agricultural environment. Through this the site activities, such as market gardening agricultural practices are indicative of the settling and development of the Heatherton region. Throughout the sites occupation there were limited changes to the built structure until its demolition. The region had a series of sand mining activity areas however, this did not extend to the site or cause disturbance to the site. By 2005 a reserve had been established across the site, whilst the relatively late demolition date of the residence may have left limited archaeological deposits, the establishment of the reserve has ensured limited subsequent disturbance to the site.
