STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Chapel of Grace McKellar House is the only surviving wind of a once extensive rural residence Bell park, erected in 1853-54 for John Bell to Picturesque gothic revival designs by Geelong Architect John Young. The Chapel wing which dates from 1861 was designed by J/L/ Shaw to match the original gothic detailing of the first section of the homestead. John Bell, a pioneer Geelong Pastoralist most probably used this wing as a billiard room annex to his distinctive rural villa. The property later gave its name to the surrounding area and the chapel is a relic of the Bell family presence and influence in the region.
