What is significant?

The High Street bridge over the Merri Creek at Northcote, constructed c.1874 and widened c.1890.

How is it significant?

The High Street bridge over the Merri Creek at Northcote.

Why is it significant?

It is historically and aesthetically significant as a rare surviving nineteenth century bridge in the Melbourne Metropolitan area. The large scale and fine architectural detailing are distinctive features. (Criteria A, B & E)

Physical Description 1

The bridge is of load bearing masonry design, comprising two large segmented arched spans. The piers are of quarry-faced bluestone and the arches are of face red brick English bond brickwork. Above each pier are coupled bluestone Doric pilasters, and a bluestone Doric entablature runs the entire length of the bridge. The metopes between the triglyphs in the Doric frieze contain vent openings. At road level, the rendered brick and steel balustrading appears to date from the 1930s.
