Interpretation of Site	Former site of Dixon's Creek State School #1585. Asphalt feature possibly associated with aprade ground. Brick and Stone Feature possibly related to chimney. Discoloured soil feature potentially associated with chimney-grey ash.

History

The original Dixon's Creek School (No. 1585) was located on this site from the 1890s to the 1910s when it was relocated to its current site along the Melba Hwy to the north. The school consisted of a small, A-framed, gabled weatherboard structure with a galvanised iron roof.
