

What is significant?

The pair of brick houses at 104 and 106 Brunswick Road, Brunswick, constructed prior to 1884.

How is it significant?

The pair of houses at 104 and 106 Brunswick Road, Brunswick is of local historical significance to the City of Moreland.

Why is it significant?

Of historical significance, as part of a group of seven relatively intact early houses in this section of Brunswick Road, with number 104 owned and operated as a local shop by Joseph Magee for many years, from before 1891. (AHC Criteria D.2 & E.1)

Physical Description 1

The attached houses at 104 and 106 Brunswick Road, Brunswick appear essentially original but with some external modification during the 1920s or 30s. Original features include exposed brick with some evidence of tuck-pointing, original and unusual roofline (gabled on the eastern end but hipped on the western end), chimney and chimney pots, and bull-nosed verandah iron. Number 106 also has evidence of an extant timber rear section, shown on the MMBW plan in 1904. External alterations include re-constructed brick party walls, bricked half-height verandah walls and columns, simple sections of timber fretwork on the verandahs, and re-roofing.
