The Brunswick Crèche is of local historical and architectural significance. It is evidence of an early and continuing expression of women's voluntary and benevolent efforts in caring for families in the Brunswick area. Architecturally, it is an unusual asymmetrical composition. Of particular note are the asymmetrical gable, Art Nouveau parapet and corbelled chimneys.

Physical Description 1

The main Brunswick Crèche building (1911) is a red brick Edwardian building with a red brick plinth. It is asymmetrical in form with a central arched entrance portico with a painted rendered coping, and a dominating half timbered asymmetrical gable. The terracotta tiled roof has three corbelled red brick chimneys with terracotta chimney pots. Windows are a combination of three-paned casements and smaller double-hung sash windows which have nine-paned upper sashes and plain lower sashes.

Key Architectural Elements: Asymmetrical red brick facade distinctive detailsparapeted entrance porch, corbelled chimneys

Conservation Guidelines: Reinstate unglazed terracotta roofing tiles remove recent fence near porch
