## Statement of Significance

Last updated on - January 1, 2008

The bluestone cottage and remains of the stables at 193 Weston Street, Brunswick, are of local historical and architectural significance. The house is typical of early bluestone cottages in Brunswick and Coburg.

## Physical Description 1

193 Weston Street is a simple single storey bluestone cottage. The front door is slightly off-centre, and is flanked by single windows. The walls are of is quarry-faced stone, with bluestone quoins and sills to timber-framed double-hung sash windows. It has a hipped slate roof and bluestone chimneys. The verandah has a bullnose-profile corrugated galvanised steel roof on turned timber posts and a decorative cast iron lacework frieze. The turned timber verandah posts and bullnose roof profile indicate the verandah is not original. Two the rear of the house is a double storey red brick wing, also with a hipped slate roof and corbelled brick chimney. The front fence, of iron pickets on a bluestone base, is possibly original.
