### What is significant?

The Narre Warren North Uniting Church (Former Methodist Church), constructed in 1933, at 1-13 Main Street, Narre Warren North.

### How is it significant?

The Narre Warren North Uniting Church is of local historic and social significance to the City of Casey.

### Why is it significant?

Historically and socially, it is significant for its strong associations with Narre Warren North community as a key public building that has played an important role as a community meeting place, and continues a use that has existed on this site since the first settlement of this area. The Narre Warren North Uniting Church is a simple gabled interwar building clad with weatherboards and cement sheet. It has exposed rafters in the eaves of the gable roof. The rear section of the building with a lower gabled roofline is presumably an early addition to the building.

The church occupies a prominent corner site opposite the Claire Robinson Reserve.
