Aesthetic value

The significance of Port Fairy, with its large number of historic buildings, is greatly enhanced by the outstanding rows of Norfolk Island Pines (*Araucaria heterophylla*) which dominate the skyline and have become a symbol of the township. These trees are of State significance and are in excellent condition although their future management will be required to maintain them in a safe and healthy condition.
