This tree is an impressive example of this species with a dense crown and wide-spreading canopy and is said to be around 100 years old. It is a dominant feature of the landscape.

Quercus suber is slow-growing and long-lived, up to 250 years of age. Cork oak bark has been harvested for thousands of years. This species is easily distinguishable from the English oak (*Quercus robur*), by its knobbly grey bark and long evergreen leaves.
