Historical significance

An Avenue of Honour commemorating World War I and 800m long. It is not intact due to the inclusion of 7 *Platanus x acerifolia* on the south side and 1 *Populus alba* on the north side. The avenue flanges out on the north-west side and powerlines run through the northern row. Despite this the avenue makes a significant landscape contribution as a memorial gateway to the town.
