

# **Statement of Significance**

### What is significant?

The dwelling, constructed c.1900, at 38 Jeffrey Street, Leongatha is significant.

#### How is it significant?

The dwelling at 38 Jeffrey Street is of local historicandaestheticsignificance to the town of Leongatha.

#### Why is it significant?

Historically, it is one of a group of dwellings in JeffreyStreetthatdemonstrate the early residential development of Leongatha.

Aesthetically, it is a locally superior example of asymmetrical Victorian villa on a prominent corner site that is an important part of the historic street scape of Jeffrey Street.

### **Physical Description 1**

'Adelong' at 38 Jeffrey Street, Leongatha is a symmetrical double fronted Victorian timber villa with a M-hip iron roof and areturn deep convex verandah supported by chamfered timber posts. The facade features three sided timber sash bay windows on either side of the front door that has sidelights and highlights, and there are paired eaves brackets separated by timber mouldings. There are three corbelled brick chimneys.

Alterations include the installation oftimber windows in the side and rear elevations, partially infilling of the verandah andthe replacement of the timber verandah floor and post bases with concrete and brick and removal of the ornate cast iron frieze. The front timber picket fence is sympathetic, but not original (an early photograph shows the original scalloped profile picket fence that once graced this property, as well as the original verandah frieze).
