### **History**

Heritage Inventory History of Site: The site marks the first officail attempt to establish a European settlement in Victoria in 1803. A contingent of over 450 people arrived at Sullivans Bay in early October. Lieutenant - Colonel David Collins decided, after some months, to transplant the settlement Van Diemens Land (Hobart). The final party left Sullivans Bay in May 1804. Although there is some doubt the graves date from this period, the site definitely marks the location of this first brief settlement.
