Interpretation of Site	Site appears to have been used continually as a pastoral property from at least c1920s to present. The artefact dump is associated with occupation from c1920s to 1960s
Archaeological Significance	Domestic/pastoral sites from the early to mid 20thC are not uncommon throughout Victoria. The artefacts were dumped at this site and have since been further disturbed. Diagnostic features may provide information on consumerism, trade and other aspects of life in early 20thC Victoria. Low significance.

History

Heritage Inventory History of Site: Numerous bottles provide an indication of the site's date. One bottle has the trademark "M.G.A 1923" - earliest dated bottle. Several M.B.C.V bottles with embossed horse-shoes, recent soft drink bottles (c. 1950's-1960's), brown poison bottles, "Vines Vinegar" bottle, brown "Pineaire" bottle (Disinfectant?). Most have screw tops. Bottles indicate that this is a recent dump dating from 1920's and up to

1960's. One plastic bottle was also noted.
