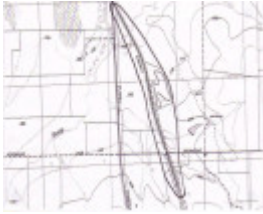

The Bunyip Railway Cutting Embankment, Gravel Pits and Overpass are **historically significant** at a **LOCAL** level. They are associated with railway engineering works undertaken to provide employment during the Great

Depression.

The Bunyip Railway Cutting Embankment, Gravel Pits and Overpass are **aesthetically** significant at a **LOCAL** level. They demonstrate important visual qualities. These qualities include the very high Bunyip bank.

Overall, Bunyip Railway Cutting Embankment, Gravel Pits and Overpass are of **LOCAL** significance.
