History

Heritage Inventory History of Site: In June 1920 the Victoria Hardwood Co. formed the Ada River Timber Co. and took over the Starlings Gap mill from the Warburton Timber Co. Timber from this mill was taken by a horse hauled 3 foot gauge tramway to Big Pats Creek, and then to LaLa siding at Worburton. The Ada River Company no longer used this railway after the High Lead inclines were opened in 1927.
