Interpretation of Site	Used as a sawmill site with tramway transportation in the early 20th C. Now area is reserve bushland.
Archaeological Significance	Low. This is a common site type in the region. The integrity of any existing subsurface archaeological deposits is potentially good due to little to no development in the area.
Historical Significance	Relates directly to an early settler in the region (Captain Cloverdell) and is an example of a major industry in the region in the late 19th C and early 20thC.

Heritage Inventory History of Site: Captain James' Cloverdell sawmill opened in 1920 and was served by a

tramway from Woori Yallock. It was apparently powered by a water wheel.
