Physical Description 1

The Shearing shed at Banavie appears to date from the mid to late 20th century and is set within other farms outbuildings. The building is rectangular with a gabled roof over the central section with wide flat skillion sections on the sides and ends. The roof and walls are clad in corrugated steel.
