## Statement of Significance

Last updated on - August 3, 2004

The Marnoo East State School, 22 Baldwin Plains Road, Marnoo East has significance as an educational centre in the local community, and as an example of a Victorian Board Education School style. Established in 1890, the building appears to be in fair-good condition when viewed from a distance.

The Marnoo East State School is **architecturally** significant at a **LOCAL** level. Although the building has experienced some changes, it still demonstrates original design qualities of a Victorian Board of Education style.

These qualities include the plan dimensions, and the gable and skillion roof forms. Other intact or appropriate qualities include square edged weatherboard wall construction, galvanised corrugated iron roof cladding and timber casement windows.

The Marnoo East State School is **socially** significant at a **LOCAL** level. It is recognised by the local community for educational and cultural reasons.

Overall, the Marnoo East State School is of **LOCAL** significance.

## Physical Description 1

The school building is in a rural setting in a grassed area with trees and shrubs. The building has a gable roof with a skillion section at one side. The roof is clad in corrugated steel. The gable ends have plain barge boards with a turned timber finial at the apex of the gable. There is a small skillion roofed porch at one side of a gable end. The walls are clad with square edged weatherboards. There are multipaned timber framed casement windows.
