History

Heritage Inventory History of Site: Tierney's Creek junctions with Haunted Stream at Stirling township. Mines operated along Tierney's Creek (mainly the lower reaches) from 1882 until the early 20th century. In the mid-1880s, Sawyer and party tunnelled on a reef near the head of Tierney's Creek—about 5 km above Stirling—erecting a battery in 1887. According to Fairweather, Dan Fay moved a battery to his mine at the head of Tierney's Creek in c.1915 from the Lone Hand mine (some distance up Haunted Stream from the Hans mine), where it had been powered by a Pelton wheel since at least the early 1900s. Fairweather tells how Fay 'set up the battery on the banks of the creek... driving the mill with a motor fuelled by charcoal gas, as petrol was at that time rationed'. Reefs at Tierney's Creek were prospected as recently as 1937.
