Interpretation of Site	Until 1885, the Yan Yean Reservoir collected water from the Plenty River. Settlements bordering the river contaminated the supply and the clear water channel carried water from the settling basin at Toorourrong Reservoir. Water from the Wallaby Creek Catchment rendered the contaminated supply unnecessary.
Archaeological Significance	The caretakers cottage was built in 1929 and destroyed by fire on February 8 2009. The site has the potential to contain artefact scatter relating to the cottage.
