Statement of Significance

Last updated on - June 1, 1995

A steel girder and trestle railway bridge taking the Melbourne - Ballarat railway over the Balliang - Bacchus Marsh Road; it replaced the 1887 timber bridge in 1930.

The bridge has local historical significance in enabling the railway's crucial influence on development of the region. Its architectural significance derives from its achievement as engineering. It has social significance as a landmark used by the community for orientation.

Physical Conditions

Some rusting is appearing on the steel members, which needs preparation and re-painting.

Intactness

Good. The earth embankments appear to have been rebuilt.

Physical Description 1

The bridge consists of two parallel massive steel rsj girders supporting the railway tracks, between earth embankments. These are supported by two trestles. Each trestle is formed from 4 corner 'legs' supported by three levels of vertical and diagonal bracing. The legs are set in reinforced concrete pedestal pad footings. Connections are bolts.
