History

Michaelis Hallenstein factory apparently established in 1864. Munro 1879 is the earliest map found to confirm this. MMBW plans 1894/ 1909 etc show the factory also and these additional buildings - a later plan. A later photo 1952 shows how it has expanded. The railway siding was added about 1915. These four building were removed by
