What is significant? How is it significant? Why is it significant?

This precinct contains the richest collection of buildings in Buninyong. Purchases of this land were made in the first year of land sales in Buninyong, in 1851, and a large proportion was subsequently reserved for church purposes. The three churches in the precinct were erected in the 1860's and together with their affiliated buildings, halls and residences, dominate the area.

This precinct is also the domain of three fine residences, and the police quarters. Together these are intact and important examples of Victorian buildings, constructed from the 1850's to the 1880's. Also these buildings include a rare and diverse illustration of Gothic styles.

Many buildings in the precinct are located in expansive grounds, in particular Netherby and the former Presbyterian Church. In addition, open spaces have largely been retained between the buildings and therefore extensive vistas become a feature of the area. Netherby and the Church of England provide important terminating vistas.

The gravel road surface, grassy verges and open channels retains the early streetscape character in Scott Street. The streetscape is also enhanced by several individual specimen trees, for example the Bunya Bunya Pine at 'Netherby', the Cedar trees at the former Wesleyan Church, and the avenue of Elm trees which line the approach to the former Presbyterian Church.
